ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS FOR HOLY APOSTLES

The following materials are needed to formally apply to Holy Apostles.

- Complete and Submit the Online Admissions Application for Angelicum Students
The *Admissions Application for Angelicum Students* may be found on the Holy Apostles website. All required fields must be completed and submitted. You will find the application link at the bottom of the first FAQ box [here](#). Please note that the application automatically saves answers as they are filled in. You may begin your application, save it, and resume it at a later time with the email link it sends you.
- Angelicum Recommendation & Transcript
Applicants must request the Angelicum Academy to provide necessary information to Holy Apostles, including a letter of recommendation and your Official Angelicum Transcript. This is requested through your application.
- Personal Statement
Applicants must provide a written statement between 300 and 500 words. It should consist of a brief autobiography as well as your reasons for applying to Holy Apostles.
- One Letter of Recommendation
Applicants must request one letter of recommendation either from a priest, religious, academic reference, mentor, volunteer supervisor, etc. You may request this letter of recommendation through your online application by entering the individual's email address and sending a request. Once your letter of recommendation has been received by Holy Apostles, it will automatically be attached to your application.
- Signed and Notarized FERPA Release Form
At the post-secondary level, parents have no inherent rights to inspect a student's education records. Since courses taken at Holy Apostles are college classes, a Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) Release Form must be downloaded from the application and completed. A scan or photo of the signed and notarized FERPA Form must be uploaded to the application.
- High School Transcript
Applicants must request the most recent copy of their official high school transcript to be sent to Holy Apostles. If you are homeschooled, your official transcript must be signed and may uploaded to your application. Alternatively, you may provide your course/grade information to the Angelicum Academy and they will consolidate your high school-level studies with their Official Angelicum Academy Transcript (see above).
- Standardized Testing Scores
If you have taken a standardized test, such as the PSAT, SAT, ACT, or CLT test, applicants should request a copy of the results to be sent to Holy Apostles.

DEGREE PROGRAMS AT HOLY APOSTLES

The following information explains your options to earn your degree at Holy Apostles.

Option 1 – Bachelor of Arts Degree

The Bachelor of Arts program at Holy Apostles is a 120-credit hour undergraduate degree that provides a philosophically-based Catholic honors liberal arts curriculum.

While enrolled at the Angelicum Academy in the AA-Track, you can earn up to 60 ACE-recommended credits by taking all Great Books and Fr. Fessio Theology courses. In addition, you can earn 15 credits from Holy Apostles as part of your AA-Track. At the completion of your AA-Track, you will have up to 75 credits applicable towards your Bachelor of Arts degree. This unique partnership allows you to get ahead by starting college with so many credits!

With only 45 credits (15 classes) remaining to then complete your Bachelor of Arts degree, you will save time and money at Holy Apostles. Within a year after you complete the AA-Track, you can graduate with your Bachelor of Arts degree! This is accomplished by enrolling full-time with 15 credits (5 classes) for three consecutive semesters (Summer, Fall, Spring). Studying part-time will still allow you to graduate sooner than your peers. Six majors (and double-majors) are available: Theology, Philosophy, Liberal Arts, English in the Humanities, History in the Social Sciences, and Sacred Art.

The National Center for Education Statistics estimates that in the 2018-2019 school year the average total tuition, fees, room and board rates for full-time undergraduates at a private institution was \$44,662 (adjusted for inflation). After four years in college, this works out to over \$175,000. Currently, tuition at Holy Apostles is \$360 per credit, or \$1,080 per 3-credit class. With up to 75 credits applicable towards your Bachelor of Arts degree, the estimated tuition to complete your remaining 45 credits for your Bachelor of Arts degree at Holy Apostles is just \$16,200.

Truly, you can feasibly earn your degree at Holy Apostles – a faithful, Catholic college – in as little as one year and for substantially less than at other private colleges and universities.

Option 2 – Associate of Arts Degree

The Associate of Arts program at Holy Apostles is a 60-credit hour undergraduate degree that provides a philosophically-based Catholic honors liberal arts curriculum.

While enrolled at the Angelicum Academy in the AA-Track, you have the opportunity to earn up to 60 ACE-recommended credits by taking all Great Books and Fr. Fessio Theology courses. Holy Apostles can accept up to 45 of these credits into the Associate of Arts degree program. In addition, while enrolled in the AA-Track, you can earn 15 credits from Holy Apostles. At the completion of your AA-Track and upon proof of high school graduation, you will be eligible to graduate from Holy Apostles with your Associate of Arts degree at the September graduation.

Two majors are offered for the Associate of Arts degree: Liberal Arts and Theology. Students in the Liberal Arts major have the option to only take the Great Books courses. Students in the Theology major must take all of the Great Books and Fr. Fessio's Theology courses.

This option is ideal if you plan to transfer to another college for your Undergraduate degree in a major that Holy Apostles does not offer. Please note that each institution has its own eligibility policies for transferring credits in from another institution.

*If you are currently unsure of your plans after the AA-Track,
it is recommended that you follow the Liberal Arts with Fr. Fessio's Theology Courses for the greatest flexibility.*
